




EAGLE

Robins feed on insects (especially beetles) and worms. Robins can also eat fruit, seeds, crushed peanuts, sunflower hearts and raisins. They particularly enjoy mealworms.

Wild ducks eat a wide range of different foods and they are constantly foraging for meals and snacks. Foods ducks regularly eat include:

- Small fish and fish eggs
- Snails, worms, slugs, and mollusks
- Small crustaceans such as crayfish
- Grass, leaves, and weeds
- Algae and water plants and roots
- Frogs, tadpoles, salamanders, and other amphibians
- Aquatic and land insects
- Seeds and grain
- Small berries, fruits, and nuts

In addition to these nutritious foods, some ducks will also eat sand, gravel, pebbles, and small shells to provide grit that aids their digestion.

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HUMMINGBIRD



Nectar, either from suitable flowers or sugar water solutions, is the most abundant and most popular source of hummingbird food. Because nectar



is liquid, it also supplies the birds' necessary water. Nectar does not, however, meet hummingbirds' needs for protein, amino acids, and different vitamins and minerals, and they must eat other things to have a balanced and healthy diet. In addition to nectar, hummingbirds eat a variety of including small insects, larvae, insect eggs, and spiders.

HERON



Great Blue Herons eat nearly anything within striking distance, including fish,

amphibians, reptiles, small mammals, insects, and other birds. They grab smaller prey in their strong mandibles or use their dagger-like bills to impale larger fish, often shaking them to break or relax the sharp spines before gulping them down.
