The Wright-Patterson Air Force Base (WPAFB) Educational Fund is a tax-exempt source of funds to provide academic achievement scholarships for the children and grandchildren of currently employed civilian and military personnel at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio.

History and Administration

The Wright-Patterson AFB Educational Fund was established in 1985 by retired USAF Colonel Nathan R. Rosengarten and his wife, Irma, as a means to recognize the academic excellence of college-bound children and grandchildren of current WPAFB military and civilian personnel. The Fund is managed by a Board of Trustees made up of current and past senior leadership at Wright-Patterson AFB.

The Wright-Patterson AFB Educational Fund has no paid employees – all donated funds directly support the scholarships. Volunteers from across Wright-Patterson AFB perform all administrative functions and operate the Fund by contributing their time and talents.

Endowment

The Wright-Patterson AFB Educational Fund endowment was established by Colonel Nate Rosengarten and his wife, Irma, to be used for the Fund's future operation and administration.

How Many Awards are Given?

Since its establishment in 1985, the Wright-Patterson AFB Educational Fund has made 1,432 awards totaling \$907,000.

The number of scholarships awarded each year and the amount of each scholarship depends upon the amount of funding available to support the program. The trend for the last several years is shown below:

How To Apply

ELIGIBILITY: Student applicants must:

- be children or grandchildren of active duty military or government civilian employees currently assigned to Wright-Patterson AFB, and
- be graduating from high school in 2023, and
- have a cumulative unweighted GPA of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale, and
- have a minimum ACT score of 27 or minimum SAT score of 1200.
