## LEGACY in the News



This summer, LEGACY (Leadership Experience Growing Apprenticeships Committed to Youth) Jr. Apprentice Naisha, assisted Maj Michael Seery at the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) with editing and updating the *Intro to ECE 210* course for cadets. This year, USAFA increased their enrollment numbers in ECE 210 by more than double last year's enrollment. In addition to updating the course, Naisha soldered, programmed robots, and built and programmed circuits using an Arduino. When asked about the summer, she added, "The (LEGACY) internship allowed me to gain a basic understanding of electrical engineering and I gained insight into a variety of course subjects. I was able to develop my independence, organization, and time management skills."

Naisha recently qualified for State in Distributive Education Clubs of America in the Marketing Communications event. She will attend the Colorado State Leadership Conference held at the Broadmoor in February. This is her second year competing, and she stated, "I'm very excited to compete, learn, and meet others at the conference."

In addition to the LEGACY program, Naisha is very involved in her community. In November, she participated in the annual cultural show called Azadi, meaning freedom, by the Indian Community of Colorado Springs. This year's proceeds were used to provide scholarships for active-duty military students enrolled in graduate and undergraduate degree programs at UCCS. The event also raises awareness, education, and appreciation of the culture and performing arts of India and transfers these values to future generations. This year, Naisha sang, danced, and choreographed a dance for 8–9-year-old students. She is also part of a singing group in her community that raises money for charity.

After Naisha completes high school, she plans to attend college and earn a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering.



# 2023 LEGACY Craftsman Camp Applications Open!


